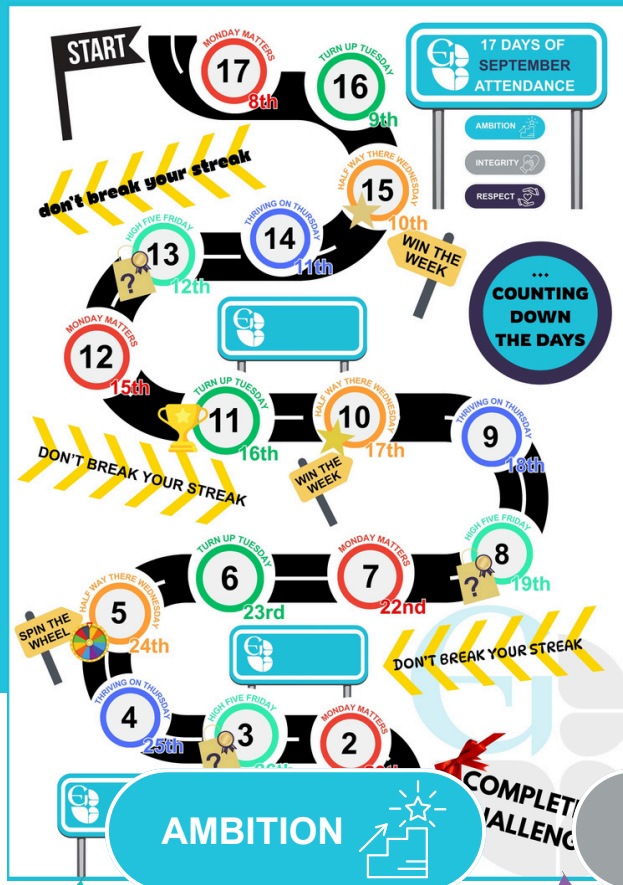

SAFEGUARDING: travelling to, and from, school.

The local area to Ellis Guilford has a number of high-risk places which our children need to be aware of. Bar Lane is very congested at 15.00 when our children leave school. Please can parents and carers park well away from school and always park legally to help keep our children safe. Police mobile traffic patrols are regularly monitoring the area and issue £90 fines for illegal or dangerous parking.

The A610/Nuthall Road is a major through-route to the M1 and is very busy. Children should always choose a safe place to cross and use the pedestrian crossings that are available. Please remind children to remain aware even when using pedestrian crossings and to only cross when the green person is displayed – checking that it is safe to do so.

Basford Crossings: The Vernon Road/David Lane level crossing presents multiple risks. Children should understand never to cross the train/tram lines when the lights are flashing and barriers are down. Please encourage our children to use the footbridge.

Bar Lane/Percy Street junction: The pedestrian crossing located on Percy Street is next to Bar Lane. Remind children to check that traffic turning left from Bar Lane has stopped before crossing. Remind them not to rely on the driver seeing the pedestrian crossing red light is on.

E-scooters and Lime e-bikes: Both are illegal for children (under 18) to use on public highways and should not be used by our children to travel to school.
