
SAFEGUARDING - Critical Incident Practice

Last week we completed critical incident fire evacuation practice with all children. I am really pleased to report that all buildings were evacuated quickly, safely and thoroughly. Our children were EGScellent in their conduct – particularly Year 7 for whom this was their first full fire evacuation practice.

This week we will be practicing our critical incident lockdown procedure. In the unlikely event that we need to keep our children safe using an invacuation (for example if there was a serious police incident on Bar Lane with the risk of an intruder on the school site) we would implement a school lockdown. During a school lockdown, children are kept safe in classrooms and external access into buildings is restricted by senior leaders. Our children will receive training and warning prior to the lockdown practice to reassure them that this is simply a drill, and to make sure they know what to do if they hear the alert.

Please talk to your children about critical incidents and the importance of planning for them – both at school and in the home. This could be a good time to review your own fire evacuation planning at home. Please <u>click here</u> for advice.
