In light of statutory changes to the curriculum of Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE) in September 2020, we have drafted a new policy in partnership with other CET schools. The statutory guidance for RSHE now states that schools must deliver RSHE by Summer 2021.

We will then review your responses and share the results of the survey by Tuesday, 1st December 2020. We will review your feedback and use it to plan our way forward. We hope to set up a working party to inform and shape our RSE provision, an option to show interest in this can be found on the survey. As part of the statutory guidance for RSHE, you will also be given the right to withdraw your student from Sex Education as part of their Skills for Life lessons.

The right to withdraw relates to any some or all of Sex Education as part of statutory RSE. The parental right to withdraw is applicable up to and until three terms before the child turns 16. After that point, if the child wishes to receive Sex Education rather than be withdrawn, the school will make arrangements to provide the child with Sex Education during one of those terms.



There is no right to withdraw from Relationships Education or Health Education.

If you would like to withdraw your student from some or all of Sex Education, you must express this in writing to the Principal to discuss the request as mentioned in the policy.
